A small dog or cat = a 40-45 year old person A medium sized dog = 50-55 year old person A large dog = 60-65 year old person A giant breed = 75-90 year old person

Diabetes
Low-grade infections
Certain hormonal diseases
Changes in liver function
Early changes in kidney function

EARLY INTERVENTION MAY BE AS SIMPLE AS AN APPROPRIATE DIET CHANGE OR MAY PROMPT ADDITIONAL TESTING OR MEDICATIONS.

HOW CAN YOU KEEP YOUR FAMILY FRIEND HEALTHIER LONGER?

Just bring in a urine sample. A new test (called ERD), along with a routine urinalysis, can detect early problems before your pet begins to show signs. Total cost for both tests is \$81.00.

WE ARE NOW RECOMMENDING THAT ALL PETS EIGHT YEARS OF AGE AND OVER SHOULD HAVE A URINALYSIS AND ERD URINE TEST YEARLY ALONG WITH THEIR ANNUAL PHYSICAL EXAMINATION. PLEASE BRING IN A SAMPLE WITH YOU, OR WE CAN ASSIST IN COLLECTING ONE WHILE YOU'RE HERE.
